Now to the Help. Region 5 needs to keep their Caller, Cuer Dancer Association alive so that we can access this insurance, as well as benefiting in other ways. Since very few people from our region ever attend the one annual meeting that is held, it is clear that most of you have no interest at all in this organization. However, if clubs had to go out and negotiate their own insurance policies, the cost would be prohibitive!

So, to keep the R5CCDA alive, the following members have volunteered their services as executive members:

Mary Anne Turner- President, John Tutte -Vice President, Krystal Leason - Treasurer and Nick Turner - Secretary. As it happens, very few business issues arise in our Region during the year but if any do, the executive members will deal with them using electronic means such as email, Skype, telephone, etc. .

This is where your help comes in. There are times when we might need feedback and information from each of the clubs. There are times when we will send information out and need to be sure that all members receive it.

So we are hoping that each club will arrange for a club member to be a liaison with the R5CCDA executive. It is not a difficult job. It is hoped that that person will:

• print a copy of any R5CCDA Bulletins sent out and take it to the club so that those who are not receiving email from us will have access to the information.

• if an issue should arise during the year, the liaison person will be asked to canvas the club for a majority opinion and let the Region 5 executive know so they may make informed decisions.

That's all ! That's it! Someone please volunteer in each club - don't make the club president twist arms.

First, we would like to Welcome our new 1st Vice President – Allen Ebl who is from Region 9. He will be looking after all requests for Grants and Please Make Sure that you use the FORMS in the Handbook when applying for those Grants. Mary Cox has updated the Handbook and each Region has a Hard Copy for their Dancer's Association and one for their Caller/Cuer's Association. More Updates have been sent out by e-mail in September as a result of changes made at the A.G.M. so make sure you insert those in your Handbook when you receive them and keep it up to date.

Each Club pays a B.C. Federation Fee of \$5.00 and a \$5.00 Canadian Society Fee. If you need a Named Certificate go to the Canadian Society Web Page www.squaredance.bc.ca and under Insurance/ Certificates you will find the form which is to be completed to receive this Certificate but Please Remember the Top portion of the form is to be completed and signed by City/Organization/Hall requesting this Certificate and the rest to be filled out by the Club. Please take Note of where this form is to be sent as we have new people dealing with the Insurance this year and also please be patient with them.

A motion was passed at the B.C.S. & R.D. Federation A.G.M. that each Region will now send only 4 Delegates to the Spring B.O.D. Meeting. This is for a 2 year trial period but please make sure that your Region has 4 Delegates and send their names and e-mail addresses to Ken Crisp kcrisp@shaw.ca before the end of 2013.

The B.C.S. & R.D. Federation also recognises Club, Caller/Teacher Anniversaries of 15, 20, 25 years and in increments of 5 years thereafter. Please make application for those to our Secretary, Ken Crisp in lots of time.
